1. Chair Scott Wayne presented the <u>minutes</u> of the May 23, 2022 Executive Committee meeting for approval

- 2. President E. Gordon Gee reported the following:
 - Institution is in healthy standing from the perspective of enrollment and talent acquisition
 - WVU will be spending a week with the WV Legislature with focus on recruiting new professionals to the state
 - 30 startup business interested in opening at the Waterfront as part of the Vantage Venture program
 - WVU Medicine Children's Hospital scheduled to open in September
 - WVU Medicine has acquired the Thomas Health System in Charleston, creating it's first location in the Kanawha Valley region
 - Peak Health, launched by WVU Medicine, has long term goals of taking over PEIA to provide higher quality healthcare to the state
 - Students reporting concern over cost, inflation, and financial access
 - Chris Gilmer has been hired as interim president at Potomac State
 - New Board of Governors member Susan Lavenski
 - West Virginia Business Summit to be held August 31-September 2 at the Greenbrier

3. Report from Provost Maryanne Reed

- Reporting just under 4800 new freshmen enrolled for fall
- New class is 60% out-of-state
- Retention concerns for the 2021 freshman cohort
 - o Test-optional students retained at a lower rate than peers with ACT or SAT scores

- "Ask Morgan" chatbot released on website 24/7 automatic response bot for common questions
- Joy Carr named Director of University Advising effective August 1
 - o Additional organizational efforts around advising likely to be announced this year
- Plans for retention efforts targeting specific populations such as Pell-eligible students
- Establishment of a completion grant program to assist students close to graduation
- Continued pursuit of collaborative interdisciplinary programs and services for faculty, and creating support for those interested in establishing new academic programs
- Pilot program for the new SEI was worked on over summer (Melissa Latimer) with reported progress
- Focus on revising and creating workload plans for academic units with a focus on being consistent, appropriate, and equitable.
- Ashley Martucci is a provost-fellow this year and will be exploring faculty leadership development opportunities
- Huron Consulting Group continues work on revising the budget to be more transparent and incentive based.
 - o Expect additional information to be released regarding budget this year.
 - New budget scheduled to take effect 2023-2024, with a hold harmless implementation year
- New hires: Tracy Morris (Associate Provost for Academic Personnel), Joy Carr (Director of University Advising), Paul Heddings (Director of Academic Integrity)
- Christine Schimmel, associate professor in CAHS, appointed the new Faculty Ombudsperson
- WVU Tech president search (Greenwood Asher Search Firm) has been narrowed to 15 candidates
- 4. Stephanie Taylor, General Council, presented detail describing Title IX and BOG Rule 1.6
 - Committee members introduced debate regarding BOG Governance Rule 1.4
 - Motion to adopt resolution <u>Annex XXIII</u> on Faculty Senate position to BOG Governance Rule 1.4.

 - The current schedule allows academic units the spring and summer of 2023 Spring/Summer of 2023 to make the changes needed to comply with new guidelines and submit them for approval
 - Town Hall meetings are scheduled for each college
 - o Faculty with scheduling conflicts may attend the meeting of another college
